WHO WE ARE

Deeply moved by the plight of street children he encountered on a trip to Kolkata (Calcutta), John O'Shea founded GOAL in 1977, and for over 40 years, GOAL has responded to almost all of the world's major humanitarian crises since, working with vulnerable communities in more than 60 countries.

While GOAL continues to be an agile first-responder to humanitarian crises, it is also committed to working with vulnerable communities to help them survive crises and support them on the road to recovery.

GOAL's purpose is to save lives and empower communities to develop resilience and greater control over their lives and livelihoods. GOAL aims to increase the resilient wellbeing of the world's poorest people and focuses on those who are excluded or marginalised, particularly those who are vulnerable due to socio-economic status, gender, or age.

GOAL believes in a world where poverty no longer exists, where vulnerable communities are resilient, where barriers to wellbeing are removed and where everyone has equal rights and opportunities.

GOAL works with the most vulnerable communities to help them respond to and recover from humanitarian crises, and to assist them in building transcendent solutions to mitigate poverty and vulnerability.

STRATEGY 2025 - GUIDING OUR WORK (FROM CRISIS TO RESILIENCE)

In the past twenty years, we have experienced the collapse of the global financial system, a global pandemic, and significant shocks to the global food system alongside the ever-deepening impact of the climate and environmental crisis.

Humanitarian crises are increasing in number, magnitude, and complexity across the globe and a growing number of states and regions are characterised as even more fragile and conflict affected.

In our globalised interconnected world, shocks in one corner can ripple across the globe. They can often worsen crises elsewhere by triggering conflict, displacement, and spirals of regressive coping behaviours.

Crises disproportionately affect those facing poverty and exclusion and threaten their lives, health and well-being, and lives. According to the International Committee of the Red Cross there are two billion people affected by fragility, conflict, or violence today

and by 2030, half of these people will live in extreme poverty. Over 100 million people are displaced due to violence and conflict and an estimated 243 million people worldwide depend on some sort of humanitarian assistance.

The international community's adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals in 2015 was a commitment to transform our world, recognising the complex interaction between humanitarian, development and peace imperatives, and the universality of the challenges faced by our global family. While there has been important progress, the UN Secretary-General clearly states that the world is 'tremendously off track' to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030. With the global pandemic, progress has stalled and, in some cases, sadly, decades of progress have been reversed.

The international community is increasingly recognising that more must be done to move vulnerable populations exposed

to disaster hazards, particularly those living in fragile, and conflict affected contexts, beyond humanitarian crisis and to achieve greater resilience. Key to this is strengthening local capacities by stabilising and supporting local systems, as populations move from crisis to survival and onto greater resilience.

To meet these growing and complex challenges, a new way of responding to crises is required and this is the cornerstone of GOAL's new strategy, titled From Crisis to Resilience. For GOAL, crises are defined as local systems being unable to respond or continue to function when confronted with risk events. GOAL works to deeply understand these shocks and stresses, including conflict, climate change, environmental degradation, rapid unplanned urbanisation, weak or unstable governances, inequality, and forced displacement. These are some of the many risks that threaten the health, safety, security, and well-being of vulnerable communities.

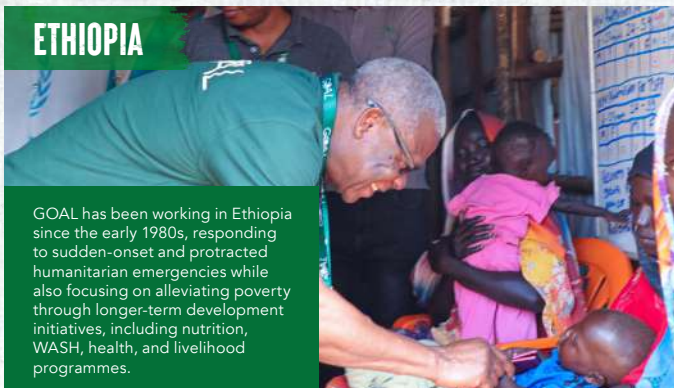
WHERE WE WORK

CHAD



In 2023 GOAL partnered with Alima and Alert Sante to provide primary Healthcare services in the East of CHAD to respond to the refugee crisis from Sudan.

ETHIOPIA



GOAL has been working in Ethiopia since the early 1980s, responding to sudden-onset and protracted humanitarian emergencies while also focusing on alleviating poverty through longer-term development initiatives, including nutrition, WASH, health, and livelihood programmes.

NIGER



GOAL has been working in Niger since 2005, supporting vulnerable communities with health, nutrition, livelihood, and emergency response programmes, with a focus on mitigating the catastrophic impacts of climate change in one of the world's hardest-hit regions.

SIERRA LEONE



GOAL has been working in Sierra Leone since 1999, responding to emergencies such as the 2014 Ebola crisis while also focusing on longer-term sustainable development initiatives that encompass WASH, health, and sustainable livelihood programmes.

SOUTH SUDAN



GOAL has been working in South Sudan, the youngest country in the world, since 1985, to build sustainable and lasting solutions to poverty and vulnerability through WASH, health, nutrition, livelihood, and emergency preparedness support.

SUDAN



GOAL has worked in Sudan since 1985, supporting communities affected by decades of civil war and mass displacement with health, livelihood, nutrition, WASH, and emergency response programmes.

UGANDA



GOAL has been working in Uganda since 1979, delivering sustainable development programmes that build community resilience and support climate-smart socio-economic growth, with a focus on health, WASH, and agricultural livelihoods.

ZIMBABWE



GOAL has been responding to the food insecurity crisis in Zimbabwe since 2002 with livelihood, WASH, and health support, while strengthening the value chains needed to foster long-term financial security.

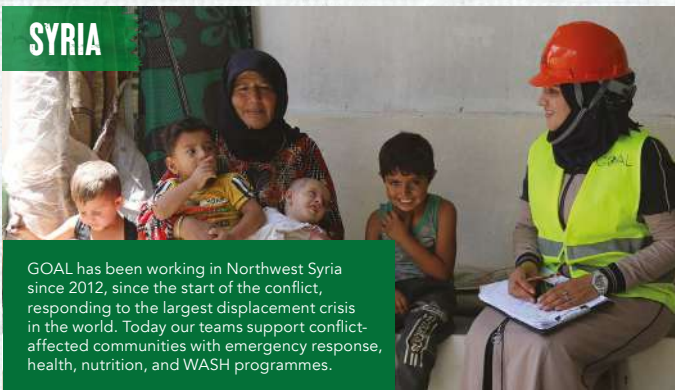

GOAL has been responding in Gaza since December 2023 through local partner, Taawon by providing food assistance to vulnerable communities in Gaza caught in the Oct 7th 2023 Middle East conflict.

SOUTH LEBANON

GOAL has been responding in the South of Lebanon since December 2023 through local NGO, Amel, providing primary healthcare in response to the possible escalation of Oct 7th 2023 Middle East conflict.

SYRIA

GOAL has been working in Northwest Syria since 2012, since the start of the conflict, responding to the largest displacement crisis in the world. Today our teams support conflict-affected communities with emergency response, health, nutrition, and WASH programmes.

TÜRKİYE

GOAL has been working in Türkiye since 2016, working with national systems to support Syrian refugee and host communities with health, protection, livelihood, and emergency response programmes.

COLOMBIA

GOAL has been responding to the Venezuelan migrant crisis in Colombia since 2016. Our teams support refugees fleeing economic collapse and civil unrest with emergency response and livelihood programmes.

HAITI

GOAL has been working in Haiti since the catastrophic earthquake of 2010 and now focuses on providing emergency response, health, and WASH support to vulnerable communities as political instability, gang violence, cholera, and dire levels of food insecurity engulf the country.

HONDURAS

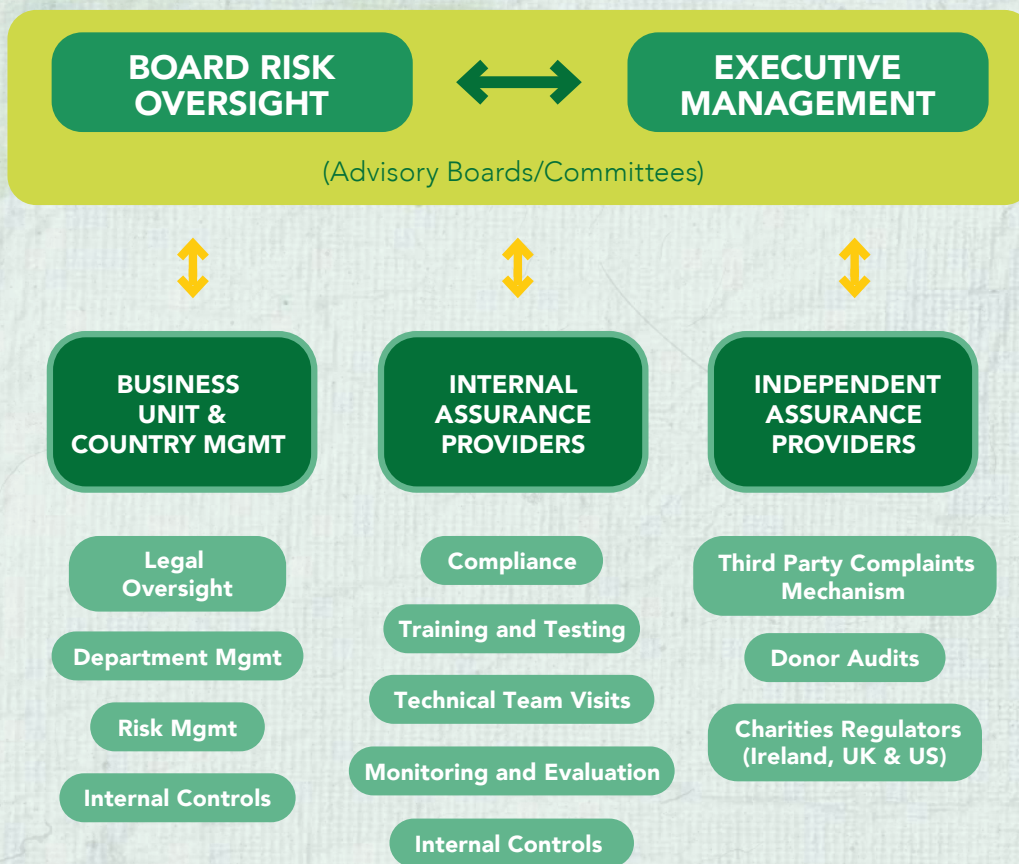
GOAL has been working in Honduras since 1998, supporting vulnerable communities with health, livelihood, and emergency response and disaster risk reduction programmes.
